Clinical features:

Typical present as a discoid patch of alopecia which shows no scaling, papules, inflammation or atrophy.

Presence of exclamation mark hair at periphery of lesion.

Site of predilection is most frequently on scalp, mustache and beard area.

Sometime on eyelashes and eyebrows. [2]

Diffrential Diagnosis:

Includes trauma from the habit of plucking hair (trichotillomania) in mentally disturbed patients and traction alopecia from tight hair rollers or hair styles that involve tension on the hair. In fungal infections (tinea capitis) there is scaling and broken hairs. Fungal spores or hyphae are visible in hair specimens on microscopy.[1]
